Membership tier	Annual cost ²	Eligibility ³
Private sector memberships		
Sponsor	\$18,800	Open to any company.
Corporate	\$8,300	Any company that supplies energy efficiency products or services that generated annual turnover that equalled or exceeded \$10 million in the last financial year must be a Corporate member, unless the company elects to apply for Sponsor membership.
Associate	\$3,500	Any company that supplies energy efficiency products or services that generated annual turnover between \$1.5 and \$10 million in the last financial year must be an Associate member, unless the company elects to apply for Sponsor or Corporate membership.
Network	\$1,500	Any company that supplies energy efficiency products or services that generated annual turnover up to the value of \$1.5 million in the last financial year must be a Network member, unless the company elects to apply for Sponsor, Corporate or Associate membership.
Public sector memberships		
Government leader	\$6,400	Open to any Australasian government agency, including federal and state government departments and agencies, and leading local governments that support the mission and objectives of the EEC.
Government	\$3,400	Open to any Australasian government agency, including federal and state government departments and agencies, and leading local governments that support the mission and objectives of the EEC.
Third sector memberships		
Education partner	\$12,000	Open to any Australasian university or higher-education establishment that supports the mission and objectives of the EEC.
Education	\$2,000	Open to any Australasian university or higher-education establishment that supports the mission and objectives of the EEC.
NGO	\$1,000	Open to any Australasian non-government organisation (NGO) that is deemed by the Board to focus largely on public-benefit or industry development outcomes.
